

GCSE Level Maths

Introduction

GCSE Mathematics is a fast track on year course covering all areas of Mathematics at GCSE level namely; number, algebra, handling data and shape and space. It is designed as a resit course for students who have not achieved a grade C at school. We follow the AQA linear specification at foundation level.

General Information

Entry Requirements: You need to have GCSE Mathematics at grade D. In some circumstances a grade E in GCSE Mathematics is acceptable. Student who do not have these entry qualifications follow the Level 1 Numeracy course in their first year as a pre-GCSE qualification.

Structure of the Course: This is a one year revision course with the emphasis placed on improving performance in problem areas, and examination technique. Some students will be offered the opportunity to enter for the November resit.

Methods of Assessment: There will be two 90 minute papers in early June, one of which in non-calculator. There is no coursework in GCSE Mathematics. There will be a mock examination in the Spring.

Future Opportunities

GCSE Mathematics at C or above is regarded as an important qualification and is essential for entry into many careers and onto many courses at University.

Additional Points To Note

It is possible to combine GCSE Mathematics with many courses the College offers, such as A or AS Levels, other GCSE resits and vocational courses.
