CHOOSING YOUR GCSE **OPTIONS - TOP TIPS**

1. IDENTIFY WHICH GCSE SUBJECTS ARE COMPULSORY

There are some subjects where there is no choice at all. You will always have to study Maths, English and Science. Your school may also insist on a language or Religious Studies.

2 DECIDE WHICH SUBJECTS YOU ARE GOOD AT AND ENJOY

What subjects do you enjoy studying at the moment? Ask your teachers what will be covered and how it will be assessed at GCSE. You'll be spending two years studying your options so it's really important that you enjoy them!

3 LET THE CHOICES BE YOURS

Don't just choose what your friends are doing! Do what you want to do.

4. CHOOSE THE SUBJECT NOT THE TEACHER

Don't pick a subject based on your current teacher. The teacher that you have now might not be the one who teaches you for GCSE.

5. THINK ABOUT YOUR FUTURE THEN WORK BACKWARDS

If you have a definite career goal or university course in mind, look at the entry requirements and work backwards. Will you need certain post-16 qualifications and if so, are there any particular subjects that you need to study at GCSE?

6 STRIKE A BALANCE

If you don't know what you'd like to do in the future, make sure your options are balanced and not too limiting.

7. GET ADVICE FROM THE RIGHT SOURCES

Your teachers are best placed to offer advice on what their subjects cover at GCSE. Careers Advisers can also help - they are trained professionals and can support you with your career plans and GCSE choices.

8. STAY CALM!

Remember, help will never be far away!

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

A LEVELS:

Students studying three A Levels will be expected to have a minimum of two GCSEs at grade 6 and three GCSEs at grade 5/4 including English Language and Mathematics at grade 5/4 or above. Or eight GCSEs at a minimum of grade 5.

VOCATIONAL SUBJECTS:

Students will be expected to have five GCSEs at grade 9-4, or a Merit in a relevant vocational Level 2 Diploma (or equivalent). In addition, students will need a grade 4 in GCSE English Language and a minimum grade 3 in Mathematics.
