The Sixth Form is proud to have been assessed for fully meeting all the accreditation criteria incorporating the intricate Gatsby Benchmarks.







#### STUDENTS QUALIFY AS MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AIDERS

We are so very proud of the 25 students who have recently qualified as Mental Health First Aiders (MHFAider®). Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) is a voluntary training course which teaches people how to identify, understand and help someone who may be experiencing a mental health issue. This follows The Sixth Form's recent achievement of Gold status by the Carnegie Centre of Excellence for Mental Health - Further Education Mental Health Award.

Sarah Ball, our Assistant Principal, is a qualified MHFA Adult trainer so offers this course to all of our students and staff each academic year. MHFA doesn't teach us to be a therapist, but it teaches us to listen, reassure and respond, even in a crisis – and even potentially stop a crisis from happening. The students learnt to recognise warning signs of mental ill health and develop the skills and confidence to approach and support someone whilst keeping themselves safe.




# CELEBRATING OXBRIDGE SUCCESS

## OUTSTANDING GCSE RESULTS

We are delighted to celebrate the success of students who have achieved exceptional GCSE English and Maths results. Students have shown incredible resilience, studying GCSEs alongside their main study programmes, securing lifechanging qualifications to support their future career progression.

This year's November resit results of 52% pass rate in English and 43% pass rate in Maths is a tremendous achievement and one that is significantly above the national benchmark for colleges and Sixth Forms in the country. GCSE resits are available for those students who had previously not yet achieved a grade 4 or above.


