



### **KEY INFORMATION - ENROLMENT**

- Your young person will be invited to our New Student Welcome Day on Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> July – Opportunity to meet teachers, talk to current students, have their ID photo taken and even take part in subject workshops
- On New Student Welcome Day everyone is tasked with pre-induction projects to complete over summer. Essential this is completed, by the time they start with us in September they will have been <u>out of the</u> <u>learning cycle for 12 weeks!</u>
- Subject areas will also issue a kit list of what they need for that subject and any trips that are planned for the year ahead with approximated costs.
- ➤ Enrolment will begin from GCSE results day (Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> August). Your young person will be informed of the date and time of their enrolment appointment. It is essential they attend in person with their GCSE results in hand.
- It is vital that you inform the admissions officer as soon as possible if your young person cannot make their enrolment appointment.
- Do not panic about results our staff will work with your young person during the appointment to ensure they have the best outcome for them.



- They will <u>never</u> have nothing to do




## HOW CAN YOU HELP THEM TO MAKE THE RIGHT CHOICES?
